- ❑ Your Catholic Home: The Angelus: Parent's Guide: Page 204. The Feast of the Annunciation is on March 25. It celebrates when the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to announce that she was to be the mother of Jesus, the Son of God. Mary said yes to the will of God, declaring, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). A special prayer that commemorates the archangel's announcement to Mary is the Angelus. Since the Middle Ages, it has been prayed morning, noon, and evening to celebrate the great mystery of Jesus' conception in Mary's womb. Today, the

most common time to pray the Angelus is at noon.
